INTRODUCTION

Although the devastating acute effects of COVID-19 are well documented, interest has recently turned the research community towards the chronic consequences of the disease. COVID-19.

About 87% of patients affected by COVID-19

continues to have at least one symptom two months after the onset of the disease, and up to 30% of people continue to have it at least one symptom, six months after onset, when SARS-CoV-2 is not present.

This chronic phase of COVID-19 got

names such as "long COVID", "post-COVID syndrome" or "post-acute consequences of Covid-19 infection.

Myalgic encephalomyelitis/chronic fatigue syndrome (ME/CFS) is a very complex and disabling,

a multisystemic chronic disease that affects millions of people worldwide.

Despite its increasing prevalence and depilitating nature, it is still largely unknown and

the general public and many medical professionals.

Understanding its etiology and pathophysiology is
limited, diagnostic criteria inconsistent, and diagnostic guidelines i
inadequate and outdated treatment. The disease was initially defined only as "persistent or
relapsing, debilitating fatigue of new onset and unknown origin," and the diagnosis was based on the exclusion
of other possibilities causes of fatigue, often ignoring the importance of other symptoms.
Considering practically the same symptomatology, the question arises whether it is one or two separate syndromes.
